5th GRADE MATH OLYMPIAD 2014

Training: *Monday* and *Thursday* mornings from 8:00 am to 8:50 am

Training begins *Thursday, January 9th, 2014*

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<u>What is Math Olympiad?</u> The Washington State Middle School Math Olympiad is an <u>advanced level</u>, state wide, middle school <u>math competition</u> for students in grades 5-8. **Teams of 3 or 4** compete to gain as many points as possible across six components: a long session problem, and five short session problems in the content areas: Number Sense, Probability and Statistics, Measurement, Geometric Sense, and Algebraic Sense. A record of each team's achievement is recorded on a Math Olympiad Certificate. Teams take home with them contest memorabilia, their team certificate, their work for later review, and results for the site where they competed.

<u>Where is the May 3rd Competition?</u> The competition is held at multiple locations state-wide on the same date. We will compete somewhere in Seattle or on the Eastside. Attending the competition is mandatory out of respect for the team members. If we don't have the minimum number of members on the team, the team could get disqualified. Therefore, <u>all students selected for Math</u> Olympiad must attend the competition on May 3rd, 2014.

Who may participate? Math Olympiad is open to 5th grade student at Puesta del Sol. However, there are a limited number of spots available. In order to give all interested 5th graders an equal opportunity to participate in Math Olympiad, there is a mandatory application. The application is attached to this information packet. The application must be filled out by the student in the student's handwriting and submitted, along with the signed citizenship contract and registration form, by Tuesday, December 10th, 2013. No late applications will be accepted. In addition to the application, all participants must attend all practice sessions, and be on time with homework packets completed (3-5 pages long), as well as keep up with their regular 5th grade classroom math

homework. Srta. Sidoine will consult with Sra. Zendejas to make final decisions regarding team participants. Parents will be notified via email by December 16th.

Because Math Olympiad material is **above** the 5th grade math level and is a competition team, please have your student consider their current math aptitude before applying. Will they enjoy the extra homework? Will they thrive under the pressure of a competition? Do they enjoy competing with a team? Do they finish their regular math homework with little assistance? Answering these questions honestly together will help determine if this is the right activity for your student.

<u>What is the cost?</u> The cost is \$100 (checks made out to Puesta del Sol PTA). In the case of financial need, PTA Scholarships are available. Please contact the Puesta del Sol PTA treasurer for confidential scholarship information. Payment will not be due until selected students have been notified. Students will be notified by December 16, 2013 and payment is due by December 20th, 2013. Tuition is non-refundable. For non-scholarship related tuition questions, please contact one of the Math Olympiad chairpersons.

When and where will Math Olympiad practices occur? The Math Olympiad classes will be held twice a week, on Monday and Thursday mornings from 8:00-8:50 am in Srta. Sidoine's classroom 201. Class will begin at 8:00 sharp! Students must be on time and prepared with their Math Olympiad binder (provided), 2 pencils, an eraser, and the completed homework packet from the previous session. Homework is to be turned in at the beginning of class to the parent volunteers in Sra. Zendejas room 200 at 7:55am. Practices begin on January 9th, 2014. A calendar of practice sessions will be provided.

<u>What is a Math Olympiad class like?</u> Typically each class session has one handout with 3 sections. The handout is broken out into 3 sections: **Section 1** deals with <u>content</u> covering the math concept and how it works, **Section 2**-<u>In Class Exercises</u>, **Section 3**-<u>Homework</u>. Sections 1 and 2 are covered in the morning class. The training is very fast passed, so the student needs to be able to keep up. <u>The</u> **student is responsible for completing Section 3-Homework and turning it in at the next class**.

What is the homework policy? Homework is necessary for students to demonstrate understanding of the material and practice new concepts. Homework will be graded each session by parent volunteers and returned to the student. Corrections must be made to any homework assignment below 80% and returned to the parent volunteers to ensure that the student understands the concept. Parents, please sign the 1st page of your child's homework so that the teacher knows you have reviewed the work with your child. If students are consistently earning below 80% on their homework, Srta. Sidoine will meet with the student and parent to re-evaluate the student's participation on the competition team.

How can I help my child? Encourage them from January to May! Help them be on top of their homework and not get behind. Make sure they are on time for the morning classes. Please help your student remember that this is a team competition and each member has a specific job. Missing practices will hurt their whole team and must be avoided as much as possible. Please plan to commit to making each practice for the entire season. If more than 2 practices are unexcused absences, then student participation in the competition will be re-evaluated. We suggest the parent and child go over the first few problems in the homework section to be sure the concept is understood. Lastly, after they have completed the homework section, review their work to make sure they understand the concept and that they have showed their work. If they do not understand the concept, it is helpful to review Section 1 with them. It is our hope that Math Olympiad will develop a lifelong appreciation for math and for team participation. Your support in making this a fun activity is greatly appreciated.

<u>How can I volunteer?</u> First help your student. Please help review their homework and go over any problems or concepts they do not understand. We will need volunteers to help with the following activities:

Homework grading: (Mondays & Thursday mornings) Answer key is provided. Please specify on the registration form which day(s) you are able to help correct homework.

Pod Supervision: Parents to supervise the students before class begins and also while they enter the pods to put away their things to make certain they are quiet and respectful of teachers who are at school early and working. Parents are also needed at the end of MO class to make sure the students go back outside and line up until the bell rings at 9:00am.

Competition Volunteers for May 3^{rd:} About 20 adult volunteers will be needed for the May 3rd competition day. One-two parents per team to be chaperones, room proctors, lunch organizers, graders or for data input on the competition day.
