Families with siblings must register and enroll in the lottery to obtain a seat in kindergarten.


Sandy Hook Elementary: Show your Support!

Flu Shots: Influenza is HERE early and it's not too late to get your flu shot! Last year we were "hit" in April/May. Seattle Children's already has 40 confirmed cases.
